## MakerSpace Policy

- 1. Prior to using the MakerSpace, Makers must
  - a. Complete and sign a MakerSpace Agreement and MakerSpace Waiver
  - b. Have a valid Lincoln Heritage Public Library account (reciprocal card is okay) AND a valid photo ID must be presented at the time of checkout.
  - c. Patrons must be in good standing with the library, with a current address on file and no fines above \$10.00.
  - d. (Minors without valid ID or library card must have a certified parent or guardian accompany them in the MakerSpace).
- 2. Makers must "check-in" with staff and sign the guest book each time they use the MakerSpace.
- 3. Makers between the ages of 8-13 years must always be accompanied by a parent or guardian.
- 4. Makers <u>must participate</u> in mandatory safety training to use any of the equipment in the MakerSpace.
- 5. When using tools that <u>do not require certification</u>, the Maker is certifying that he/she is capable of using the tool or equipment in a safe and proper manner.
  - a. Cricut cutting machine
  - b. Sewing Machine
  - c. Embroidery Machine
- 6. When using tools that <u>do require certification</u> the Maker must agree to participate in a safety training for the following equipment before use:
  - a. Sketch 3D Printer
  - b. VHS/DVD Converter
- 7. LHPL staff is available to assist in explaining the operation of tools and equipment and will make materials such as manuals available upon request.
- 8. LHPL provides access to safety supplies in the MakerSpace. (safety glasses, gloves, first aid kit, and fire extinguisher).
- 9. Unless previously scheduled for use by staff, tools and equipment are available on a first come, first served basis for use in the MakerSpace only.
- 10. LHPL reserves the right to refuse entry to or remove from the MakerSpace anyone who are in violation of polices.
- 11. Equipment in the Makerspace may be used only for lawful purposes. The public will not be permitted to use equipment to create material is:
  - a. Prohibited by local state or federal law.
  - b. Unsafe, harmful, dangerous or poses an immediate threat to the well-being of others.
  - c. Obscene or otherwise inappropriate for the library environment.
  - d. In violation of another's intellectual property rights. (For example, the 3D printer will be used to reproduce materials that is subject to copyright, patent, or trademark protections.
- 12. LHPL reserves the right to refuse any request for use of equipment in the space.
- 13. LHPL is not liable for any damaged materials or media belonging to persons utilizing the equipment in the space of facility.
- 14. The copyright law of the Unites States governs the making of copies or other reproduction of copyrighted materials. The person using the equipment is liable of any infringement.
